## CONSERVATION

Did you know that ticks are active on Cape Cod all year any time the temperature is above 40°F?

Ticks present in Barnstable County include deer ticks, lone star ticks, and dog ticks that can carry Lyme, babesiosis, Rocky Mountain spotted fever, and other diseases. As gardeners, we want to experience the satisfaction (and challenges) of gardening without putting ourselves at risk for these diseases.

Question: How do we garden without exposing ourselves to ticks?

Simple answer: Wear clothing treated with Permethrin.

LL Bean sells treated clothing that is effective for 70 washes, and Insect Shield is another brand widely available, also rated for 70 washes. You can also purchase Permethrin and spray your own clothes or send your clothes out for treatment.

The Barnstable County Department of Health and Environment offers free tick testing for county residents. If you encounter a tick, check their website for instructions on proper tick removal. Note that not all ticks carry disease. If you bring the tick in for testing, the health department can identify which species bit you so you can receive appropriate medical treatment.
