2nd Floral Design 101 Workshop, **Monday, December 18.** We'll make **horizontal designs** - longer on the right & left as compared to last month's oval designs. Typically placed on a coffee table or dining table arrangement. Would this look great on your New Year's Eve table?

Sharon Dower, see video below, makes a design one color - all white. Perhaps an all red design would look smashing with evergreens as your holiday table arrangement. Your choice - all white or all red, see how key a monochromatic color is when learning horizontal designs.

medium carnations (recommended in video).

#### Oval Design, fall or holiday centerpieces for a table or mantel


