Historian's Corner/Ann Rosseel

Here's a little blurb from a club clippings written by Valerie Ciluzzi in one of her columns in 1993. The notes were from Memoirs of Hyannis and the years were between 1914 and 1929.

"It is interesting to learn that gardening used to be encouraged in our school system."

"Hyannis was a much more rural community than it is today. Before the eighth grade arrived, each student was assigned a plot of ground perhaps six feet by three on the Normal School Property. On this hallowed ground we planted seeds and kept a notebook to record the results, thereby learning at an early age something of how to plant a garden and raise vegetables. "

"In the Club of Distinction Annual Report, there was a section asking:

"How has your Garden Club encouraged non-gardeners (children, seniors, etc.) to garden? Describe the program:"

"As we look back to our own childhood or teen years, can we remember when or what people introduced us to gardening? Maybe by looking back we can gain insight about encouraging others to garden."

This is as true today as it was way back in the years between 1914 and 1929!

All of the bouquets' stems were clipped at the finish, so that they could be free-standing in a bowl/saucer of water. Members are encouraged to pick flowers, flowering shrubs and greens from their gardens to practice the spiral technique.
